Money Available For After-School Programs

Funding is available for after-school programs. **The subcontracting agency or organization can receive up to \$300 per child.**

WHY: This provides a safe, supervised environment during those critical hours between the time school is out and the time adults in the family are home.

TARGET YOUTH: 10- through 14-year olds (5th - 8th graders)

WHEN: The "critical hours" - 3-6 p.m. during the school year (But can be held between 2-7 p.m.)

PROGRAM INFO:

- Provide at least 40 contact hours on at least 15 separate weekday afternoons over six to 10 consecutive weeks.
- Meets at least 2 days per week (except during holiday weeks) for at least 2 hours per session.
- 10-15 hours of the programming includes one of four model programs: *All Stars*, *Project Alert*, *Too Good For Drugs and Violence*, or *Positive Action*. We provide training.
- Can be added to an existing after-school program.
- Ratio of 12 youth to 1 adult.
- Minimal amount of paperwork.

SUBCONTRACTORS:

Agencies, schools, churches, and community organizations can be subcontractors. Program supervisor must have a college degree and willing to become certified.
